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Buying materials can be tricky, especially to a beginner. In the following list, I have outlined both a “cheap” option, and a “quality” option. The Quality options are the materials that I myself and professional artists use; the “cheap” option are a more affordable or accessible alternative. Either options are perfectly acceptable to use for the workshop.

If you prefer not to buy the materials, you may rent the studio supplies for an additional fee.

- Canvas or Panel, 8x10 or 9x12.

Quality brand: Raphael Oil Primed Linen Panels

Cheap Brand: Strathmore Canvas Paper, or any canvas or panel of your preference.

-Drawing Pencil, 2B

Quality brand: Staedtler, or Faber Castell (please note: this hyperlink links to a pencil set. You only require one pencil for this class. Pencils can often be bought as singles in art stores.)

-Kneaded Eraser

Recommended brand: Faber Castell

Drawing Board: 13x17 inches, or up to 18x18 inches

Cheap Brand: any piece of Masonite, cut to size, or similar wood material. Can be obtained at Home Depot

Artist Tape

Oil Paints:

The following are the recommended basic palette; if you have other colors already, they are welcome too, but not required.

Titanium White

Ivory Black

Cadmium Red, Vermillion, OR Alizarin Crimson

Cadmium Yellow (light preferred)

Cobalt Blue OR Ultramarine

Optional: Viridian Green

“Cheap” brand: Windsor & Newton

“Quality” brands: Gamblin, Old Holland, Michael Harding

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Odorless Mineral Spirits: Gamblin, by Gamsol

(Please do NOT bring hardware-store mineral spirits.)

One glass jar for mineral spirits, or a turpentine holder.

Brushes: an assortment of sizes and shapes. Recommended synthetic brushes, a few some Flats, Filberts, and Rounds. Size 2 - 4 most commonly used, but include a large brush or two (size 8/10), and a detail brush or two (size 0).

Cheap brand: This Artist Brush set. (This are not the highest quality set, but they will give you a large assortment of brushes for a very low price.)

Quality brand: Michael Klein Synthetic Rounds by Rosemary Brushes

Palette Knife (preferably diamond-shaped, and flexible)

Recommended brands: Liquitex, or Artist Loft

Palette Paper, 12x16

Medium: Linseed oil or Galkyd Gel by Gamblin

(If using linseed oil, bring either a small jar or medium cups)

Optional:

Brush holder

Paper Towels

Wipes (for your hands)
